Picketing Concerns on Overlook Circle

They have driven there on several occasions from 7:00-8:00 PM and sounding their horns

Apparently, he removed a clergyman from his position in Queens, NY, and some people did not approve. He is now being picketed by loud protestors from Queens. They have also been known to stop, attach posters to the home's fence, shout through a megaphone and place flyers on parked automobiles, and the neighbors are upset. An open-air assembly permit is required in New Rochelle for demonstrations.

Bishop Irinej was born in 1955 in Cleveland, Ohio. He spent most of his career in the field of education, lecturing at Loyola University in Chicago, and at the Theological Faculty of the Serbian Orthodox Church in Belgrade. For many years he was the co-editor of The Path of Orthodoxy, the official publication of the Serbian Orthodox Church in the USA and

reference calling for his demise, in a manner similar to the action of a Serbian medieval hero, Milos Obilich, who gutted the Turkish Sultan at the Battle of Kosovo

WELCOME NEW RESIDENTS To Beechmont

On behalf of the Officers and Board members of The Beechmont Association, we would like to extend to you a sincere and hearty welcome to Beechmont.

The centerpiece of our residential area is Beechmont Lake which is presently undergoing restoration by the City and should be completed by this spring. Beechmont Lake is designated by the City as being a passive recreation area with fishing and ice skating permitted. The Beechmont Association is now in the process of pursuing the building of Pinebrook Path, a long dormant project since 1971. In addition, residents and members have been active in traffic mitigation on Beechmont Drive and Pinebrook Boulevard.

Pinebrook Path Proposal

One of the original drawings from the workshop of Kaneji "Kan" Domoto, landscape architect for the Pinebrook Path is shown below. He attended Stanford University and UC Berkeley, and was interned at the Granada War Relocation Center during World War II. He studied with Frank Lloyd Wright in Taliesin and had a 50+ year career. He realized multiple projects in Usonia, a cooperative in Pleasantville. Usonia was a historic community, that was planned by Frank Lloyd Wright. Domoto lived on Pinebrook Boulevard in New Rochelle and designed

"Landscape architect, Kaneji Domoto, has suggested to The Beechmont Association that a "path" be constructed along the center of Pinebrook Boulevard. He would design (and contribute his fee) a 4 ft. wide all-weather surface, winding "walk" from Beechmont Lake up to the end of the Pinebrook Mall (wooded center section). Children would use it walking home from Albert Leonard, dog-walkers would use it and in general, residents would find that it created a most attractive parklike atmosphere. The cost would have to be borne by the City, but a Beechmont member has suggested that the Association do its share." In a recent meeting the City Fathers spoke favorably of the plan.

Traffic Study

Provident Design Engineers conducted a study entitled "Iona College - Town and Gown Study" last year that recommended safety traffic improvements such as elimination of sight distance hazards, radar speed signs, warning signs, and speed enforcement. Pavement markings and delineators to narrow intersections and lower speeds of turning vehicles. It stated that any installation of crosswalks should include pedestrian landing areas and median islands which would require capital projects to design and construct.

Mayor Bramson, Council Member Kaye, and the City Manager Strome all agree with the Traffic Engineer's assessment. As a result, they will move forward with the recommendations of Patrick Sbano, Traffic Services Division, Director of Traffic Engineering.

New Men's Basketball Coach at Iona: Hall of **Famer Rick Pitino**

Rick Pitino, 68, who has taken four different programs to the NCAA basketball tournament and coached two national championship teams, takes over for Iona Coach Tim Cluess, who stepped down as head coach after ten years due to health concerns. Coach Cluess will serve as an advisor to the basketball program moving forward.

The Gaels were crowned MAAC Tournament Champions in 2013, 2016, 2018 2019 MAAC

Regular Season Champions in 2012, 2014, 2015 and 2019. The Cluess-led program set a school record with 17 conference wins in 2013-14 and 2014-15.

During his 32 seasons as a collegiate head coach, coach Pitino has a 770-271 overall record. He was named head basketball coach of Iona College on March 14, 2020. He became the first coach to take three different schools to the NCAA Final Four and first coach to win an NCAA

Championship at two different schools. Pitino holds the third highest winning percentage in NCAA Tournament games (.740) among all active coaches.

Pitino, who has a stellar reputation for success on the court and a dedication to student-athlete academic success, has served as head coach of the University of Louisville (2001-2017, winning the 2013 NCAA Championship), University of Kentucky (1989-1997, winning the 1996 NCAA Championship), Providence College (1985-1987), Boston University (1978-1983) and Hawaii (last six games 1975-1976). While often choosing to do so anonymously, Rick has served as a charitable benefactor for a broad spectrum of worthy causes.

Pitino served as coach of the New York Knicks in 1987-1989. The year before he arrived, the team had only won 24 games and in just two years, Pitino led the Knicks to their first division title in nearly twenty years. He resigned from the Knicks in 1989. The Boston Celtics hired him as head coach in 1997 and he resigned in 2001. The twotime national championship winner at Kentucky (1996) and Louisville (2013), most recently coached powerhouse Panathinaikos in Greece in the EuroLeague (2018-2020)

So far, the 2020-2021 has been interrupted three times because of Covid-19 and quarantines. Iona basketball is scheduled to play a game on Wednesday, February 10 versus Saint Peter's or 49 days since its last game. Since December nine players, and three coaches, including Pitino, have tested positive for the COVID-19 virus. In addition, two team managers and a staff member have also tested positive. To be eligible for the NCAA tournament, teams must play at least 13 games. Whoever wins the MAAC Tournament is automatically eligible. Games may be seen on ESPN3 or ESPN+.






documents. The **History of Beechmont 1902 – 2016** was compiled from various sources and is by no means complete.
